

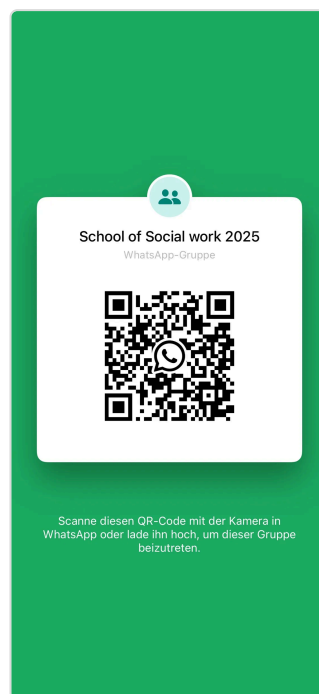

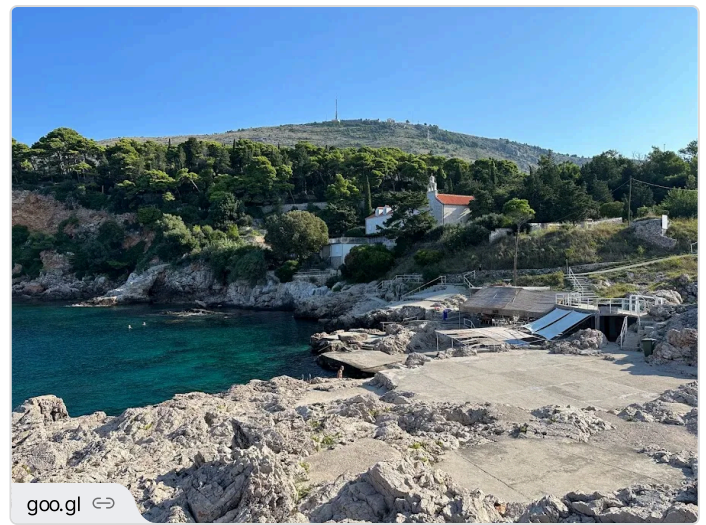

Joris Roelofs from the University of Amsterdam. is also a musician, playing jazz clarinet, and holds the chair of jazz clarinet at the Amsterdam Conservatory. During his doctoral studies, he is working on Hannah Arendt's philosophy, and will give a presentation on the topic of "The Art of the Virtuoso": Hannah Arendt, the Performing Arts, and Improvisation". After his talk, he is offering to the participants of his and other programs a jazz performance. His presentation will be on **Wednesday, September 10th** at 17:00, and at **18:15** he would treat us to a jazz performance.

Joris Roelofs is a bass clarinetist, composer, teacher, and PhD candidate, based in Amsterdam. Joris has performed with artists such as Brad Mehldau, Lionel Loueke, Meg Stuart, and the Vanguard Jazz Orchestra, among many others. For nearly ten years, he has been performing as a duo with the drummer and artist Han Bennink. After completing his master's degree at the Conservatorium van Amsterdam in 2007, Joris recorded his debut album, *Introducing Joris Roelofs* (2008). Since then, he has released several albums as a sideman and bandleader. Joris currently lives in Amsterdam and chairs the Clarinet Department (Jazz) at the Conservatorium van Amsterdam. Joris writes philosophical essays and articles and gives presentations on improvisation-related topics. His article, "To Lie Beyond Good and Evil: A Musical Question of Truth," was published in the peer-reviewed journal *Tijdschrift voor Filosofie*. Over the years, Joris has explored the intersection of philosophy and improvisation, leading to the creation of a Master's elective titled "Freedom and Improvisation," and to publications in *Tijdschrift voor Filosofie*, *Hollands Maandblad*, and the volume *Muziek Zit Tussen je Oren*. He is currently working on his dissertation, which explores the political dimension of improvisation and draws on the thought of Hannah Arendt.
