- The town of Rijeka is the 3rd largest town in Republic of Croatia. According the last census, there are 128,735 citizens in Rijeka.

- Average net salary in the town of Rijeka is 4,616 Kuna; average net salary in Republic of Croatia is 5.681 Kuna.
- According to the HZZ (Croatian Employment Bureau) data from 2011, the number of unemployed persons in the town of Rijeka was 10.034 which turn out to be 6,3% of the total population.


Aim of the City of Rijeka's Social Welfare Programme

- Protecting a socially most vulnerable group of inhabitants who, due to unfavourable personal or social circumstances, are not in a position to independently meet their own basic living needs
- Providing (psycho)social support to socially sensitive groups of inhabitants (i.e. children and youth, women and families, individuals with a physical disability, individuals with severe and chronic diseases, victims of war, homeless, elderly)

City of Rijeka's Social Welfare Programme

Implemented since 1993 Made up 5% of the 2013 city budget 40 mil Kuna (5.5 mil Euro) 24 social measures and 70 projects/programmes aiming to provide social welfare services and empowerment of the socially most sensitive groups

Who Enforces the City of Rijeka's Social Welfare Programme?



Users of the City of Rijeka's Social Welfare Programme in 2010

- → 12.425 users receive forms of the city's support
- Users fulfilled a total of 22.720 rights, therefore on average, one user is eligible to 1,8 forms of support

- Users who are eligible and meet one of the following government rights
 - The right of permanent support
 - The right of benefit for aid and care
 - The right of aid and care in the house
 - The right of personal disability benefit

Users who are eligible for child benefits or whose average income in the last 3 months was under:

▶ singles	2.000 kn	(ca 270 EUR)

two-member family
 2.900 kn (ca 392 EUR)

▶ three-member family 3.900 kn (ca 527 EUR)

▶ four-member family 5.000 kn (ca 676 EUR)


▶ for each additional member + 700 kn (ca 94 EUR)



- Individuals with disabilities and specific categories of individuals with chronic diseases regardless of their income:
 - The blind
 - The deaf
 - Individuals suffering from cerebral and children paralyses
 - Individuals suffering from multiple sclerosis
 - Kidney patients (both those undergoing dialysis and transplanted)
 - Individuals with a physical disability of 70% or more
 - Bedridden individuals, as well as those with severe movement difficulties

What Forms of Support are Users Eligible for?

- Benefits for residence costs (N=6,360 households)
- Benefits for travelling expenses (N=5,252 persons)
- Benefits for nutrition costs (N=3,637 persons)
- Benefits for health and social service expenses (N=117 persons)
- Benefits for costs of children attending infant nurseries and nursery schools (N=1,032 persons)

- Lunch for pensioners

4. Benefits for Health and Social Welfare Services Costs

- Accommodation at the Psychiatric hospital Lopača
- → Accommodation at the Home for half-day stay of children Tić
- Usage of the aid and care house service

5. Benefits for Children Attending Infant Nurseries and Nursery Schools

 Accommodation of children at infant nurseries and nursery schools

6. Monthly Financial Support

Monthly financial support for pensioners (minimal pension in the amount of 1.200 kn or 162 EUR guaranteed to each retired person, i.e. pension supplement in the amount of 150 kn or 20 EUR to those receiving pension in the amount of 1.000 kn to 1.400 kn (135-189 EUR)

7. Various Non-Repetitive Supports

- Gift-vouchers for newly-born babies
- Gift-vouchers for school books
- Financial support for veterans' children education
 (i.e. children of deceased, imprisoned or missing veterans)
- Financial support for firewood
- Reimbursement of funeral service costs


8. Emergency Accommodation

- From 2000, capacity expanded in 2004
- At three locations
- Contract regarding the usage of emergency accommodation is drawn up as an emergency intervention document for the period of 2 years
- ca 400 users

- Children and youth
- Women and family
- War victims
- Homeless
- Physically disabled and children with developmental problems
- Individuals with severe and chronic diseases
- Elderly

- 70 projects/programmes
- 27.352 users, 3.155.251 kuna (432.226 Euro)
- 61% males, 37% females (2% missing data)
- 7% aged 15; 5% aged 16-29; 58% aged 30–64; 25% aged 65+ (5% missing data)

- Most programmes/projects directed towards psychosocial support to the disabled and children with developmental problems, as well as to war victims
- Most of the funds allocated to programmes/projects for individuals suffering from severe and chronic diseases



- 70% projects/programmes designed to empower a socially sensitive groups
- 56% projects/programmes directed towards raising public awareness for problems of a socially sensitive groups
- 56% projects/programmes directed towards providing social welfare services
- 20% projects/programmes designed to provide a friendly environment for a socially sensitive groups
